Uganda

Mbalala School is in the Mukono district of Uganda, the school seriously lacks funding and the children survive from two bowls of porridge per day. The buildings are dangerously unstable and need major maintenance. The school owns 1.3 acres of land which is extremely fertile and perfect for farming.

Our goal with this project is to provide the school with a new form of income. Working alongside the staff and parents to empower them to create a sustainable revenue source to fund education, food and school improvements.

Sickle Cell Anemia

This project aims to work with Sickle Cell patients in Bahrain to overcome the social stigma they suffer. Through workshops and training, we are helping two women to set up their own business.

Team Sustainability

- Active recruitment drives twice a year focused heavily on intake of 1st year degree students
- Weekly committee meetings to ensure strong communication
- Weekly project meetings to consistently drive projects forward
- Regular training events to develop the skills and capabilities of our members
- Social events for society cohesion

Sustainable Events

We run a commission based project selling personalised clothing as sales representatives of a student run business.

One-off Events

We currently host an annual club night in our Student's Union which delivers a consistent profit averaging £1500. This year we have also started an annual 'Jailbreak' competition, encouraging students to raise money for the society by hitchhiking as far from Guildford as they can with no money. Other one off events includes a University-wide Easter Egg Hunt and various Krispy Kreme sales.

Future Ventures

We have secured a contract to organise the annual Surrey Business School Ball, all profits of which will be kept by the society. This is expected to generate profit in excess of £2,500 for Enactus Surrey. The team is also setting up a bike rental business on campus, expected to make £2,500 profit in its first year.

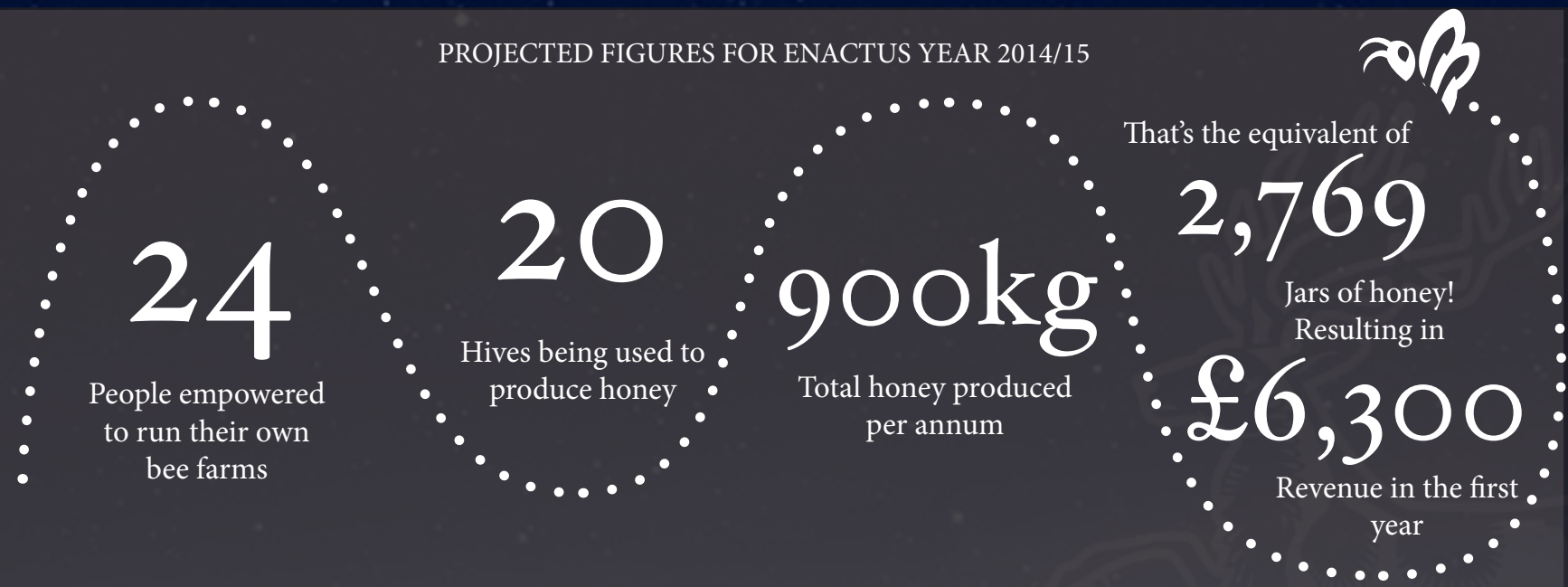


PROJECTED FIGURES FOR ENACTUS YEAR 2014/15

A recent addition to our portfolio – Hives Empower Lives, is located in the Wof Washa region in Ethiopia. The project works with young adults – many of whom have families, providing training courses, empowering them through business knowledge and helping them set up a honey soap and candle business.

We have established a UK based project partner, Sunarma; who are providing us with local knowledge and the land where we are using to run the project.

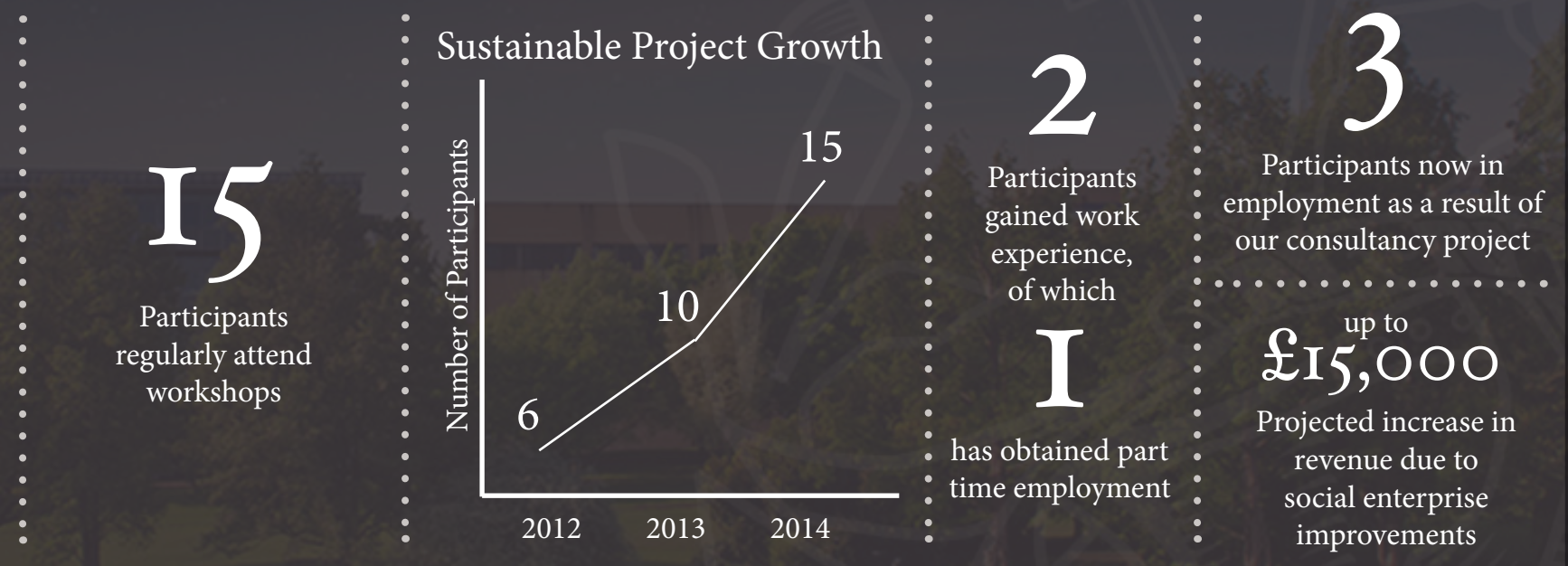
This is an incredibly exciting international project that has the potential to change many lives for the better.



The Oakleaf centre is a mental health charity based in Guildford. Many of their participants have been unemployed for a long period of time and lack self-esteem, confidence and skills to re-enter the workplace. NHS cuts, coupled with increasing expenses have meant the centre has struggled to remain financially sustainable.

Our project is working with Oakleaf in two areas. We are working with the centre to enhance the content and deliverance of their training programmes for participants.

We are also working with the centre to transform their printing business into a sustainable social enterprise to support the financial needs of the charity. Empowering the charity to survive will positively impact the 125 individuals who regularly use the centre.



The Linden Centre is a last resort for students that are at risk of being permanently excluded from the education system.

This year are working with the students at the centre through educational workshops with the aim to inspire them to continue into further education or start work so that they do not become NEETS (not in education, employment or training).

We have done this through transferring knowledge on business skills such as marketing, finance and event management, as well as empowering the students to apply for work experience. This will help to develop their CVs and provide a reference which will help dilute concerns about their academic backgrounds.
